Suffering through the struggles of raising a family says, "I am a parent. That's vhat parents do." Mental suffering that iccompanies committed love says to the world hat "I am married. This is something to be 'alued." Suffering seems to accompany our ommitments and consequently contributes o our identity. We don't suffer over what s unimportant in our lives. When Peter ecognized that Jesus was the Christ, the 4essiah, Jesus then pointed out what sort of ommitment accompanied being the Christhat he would suffer greatly, be killed, and then ise on the third day. It was all much to Peter's lismay, especially when Jesus noted that those vho follow him can expect similar suffering.

The suffering that flows from our own ommitments may not pin us to a physical ross, but it often reveals a faithfulness to live ut the values of Jesus. For people of faith, hose values become woven into our everyday iving: of raising a difficult child, caring for ging parents, working at jobs that sap our nergy, or tolerating those who are unkind. It is a conscious expression of our faith, yet it oes point to who we are—followers of Jesus.

Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows became a standard devotion in the

Church around the 14th century. It was revealed to St. Bridget of Sweden (1303–1373) that devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary's Seven Sorrows would bring great signal graces. The devotion consists in praying seven Hail Marys while meditating on the Seven Sorrows of Mary: 1) The Prophecy of Simeon (Luke 2:34-35); 2) The Flight into Egypt (Matthew 2:13-21); 3) The Loss of Jesus for Three Days (Luke 2:41-50); 4) The Carrying of the Cross (John 19:17); 5) The Crucifixion of Jesus (John 19:18-30); 6) Jesus Taken Down from the Cross (John 19:39-40); 7) Jesus Laid in the Tomb (John 19:39-42).

Advance Stewardship Reflection on the Lectionary Readings

September 15, 2024 Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time IS 50:5-9A: PS 116:1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 8-9; JAS 2:14-18; MK 8:27-35

Jesus addresses His disciples saying, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." We are Jesus' disciples, and He is speaking those same words to us here and now.

Living a life of discipleship is not always easy. It requires us to be imitators of Christ — who suffered, died, and rose from the dead out of total love for each one of us. This means we are called to share in Christ's sufferings by taking up our cross and following Him daily.

But what does this look like in our day-to-day lives?

We can start by making a firm resolution to follow Christ today, here and now, and renewing that resolution each day when we rise. This requires time with Him each day — speaking and listening.

We should also strive to pick up our crosses each day with Christ by our side. Our cross might be suffering from an illness, fighting an addiction, a day of screaming kids, or a period where things just don't seem to go our way. Instead of avoiding these sufferings or complaining about them, we are called to carry them with Christ, allowing Him to transform us through them.

If we live life constantly focused on us, we will ultimately lose ourselves, but if we surrender our lives for Christ and His mission, we will gain eternal life and become more alive than we could have ever imagined, "For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it." This takes daily commitment and requires endurance in our faith, which can only be done through active discipleship.



Dear Padre.

Why does OCIA take so long? I've been married to a Catholic for fifty years and would like to become Catholic. My parish's Order of Christian Initiation of Adults program runs from September through Easter. That's a long time for someone in her eighties. Is there any way to accelerate the process?

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults and the new name for RCIA) was designed to meet the needs of two main groups; those who have been baptized as Catholics or in a Protestant tradition but have received no additional instruction in the Catholic faith, and those who have not been baptized. Someone in the first group has a

different starting point from someone who has little knowledge of Christ, or who has never participated in a church community. OCIA programs use an instruction process called catechumenate, in which people seeking to become Catholic (catechumens) experience a worshiping community, learn to pray, and reflect on God's word. The catechumenate is divided into steps that are marked by liturgical rites; some parts of the process are optional, depending on each catechumen's pastoral situation. Catechumens can be received into the Church at any time of year. Talk to your priest about your closeness to Catholicism since your marriage and how it has formed your faith. Together, you can determine the amount and type of preparation that's right for you. .
