# When Worlds Collapse



hen personal worlds collapse, we can lose our way. The stars that marked our path through life disappear. When everything in life on which we had depended is shaken, we can feel life is not worth living. It happens when someone we love dies, when life-threatening illness lays us low, when a relationship disintegrates without warning. Then the world we once knew is no more. This week's Gospel suggests "when you see these things happening, know that he is near, at the gates" (Mark 13:29). But how can that be?

I met Marguerite and Ken when I came to the parish. A short time later, I received a phone call that Ken had suffered a massive heart attack. He had gone down to the basement for something, and that was where he died. I spent some time with Marguerite, and as you can imagine, she was wrapped in grief. They'd had a wonderful marriage, she told me, had done everything together. Whatever one did, the other went along. Two years later, Marguerite and I were talking and she began telling me how life had changed for her without Ken. She still missed him terribly. But lately she found herself involved in all sorts of parish activities and services she never would have gotten into, simply because they had always done things together. Without Ken, she found new worlds she never knew existed. For Marguerite, God had opened the gates to new life.



# PLEASE LET US KNOW BY TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 19, WHAT YOU WOULD LIKE TO VOLUNTEER FOR SO WE CAN PRIOTIZE THE PROJECTS AND WHAT SUPPLIES WE MAY NEED.

- Trim all trees that hang over the roof of the Church and RE Buildings. Trim palm trees of dead growth
- Run a new electrical line from the well to the Garage. This is so that we can eliminate the Temporary electrical pole that the church pays monthly for, \$40 per month
- 3. Replace the weather stripping on the bottom of the 2 doors in the church.
- 4. Clean and reorganized the altar server area (Church kitchen)
- 5. Install new LED Lights in the altar server area (Purchased already)
- 6. Remove the old dishwasher in the altar server area
- 7. Repaint the door to Father's area
- 8. Repaint the wall in the church entrance and hallway
- 9. Finish the Drainage project
- Need to remove the fence, poles etc. and the Stature of the Blessed mother for AC Replacement
- 11. Finish Pressure washing the buildings
- 12. Need to make the Confessional area
- 13. Reorganize & Cleanout RE Storage Rooms
- Need to sort books and place on shelves in the Library(RE Building) Shelves are not secured to the wall
- 15. Cut down all trees that are dead
- 16. Cut grass as far as we can into the woods and along 231.
- 17. Need to remove any wax that is on the pew seats and backs
- 18. Work on the garage, installing shelves and reorganization
- Need someone to Inventory all items in the following areas: Church, RE Building, Hall, Garage and all outdoor items(courtyard and other outdoor areas)
- 20. Carpets need to be cleaned in the Church and the Hall.
- 21. Need signs installed for Visitors and Handicap. Already purchased
- 22. We also have a few Crape Myrtles that need planting as well.
- 23. If anyone would like to adopt a special area, such as around the light fixtures by the sidewalks, the courtyard or the areas in the parking lot by the palm trees, to do gardening in these areas. You can Plant flowers, low ground cover etc., please us know. We have the edging material donated already.
- Need to run cable thru the church attic to relocate the sound system (BLACK BOX by the Altar) to the rear of the church and get all of the new Mics & cables run for the choir.

> Steward Reflections on the Readings November 17, 2024 Thirty-Third Sunday In Ordinary Time DN 12:1-3; PS 16; 5, 8-11; HEB 10:11-14, 18; MK 13:24-32

Today's readings are in stark contrast to the joy of the holiday season that is fast approaching, warning us instead of dark times ahead and our inevitable judgment day.

The first reading from the prophet Daniel describes a time "unsurpassed in distress since nations began" and warns that "many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake; some shall live forever, and others shall be an everlasting horror and disgrace." The second reading, from Hebrews, speaks of Christ who "waits until his enemies are made his footstool."

However, when we firmly establish for ourselves as individuals — as a family and as a parish that we will give to God the first and best portion of our Time, Talent, and Treasure — the warnings we read in the Scriptures today should be no cause for alarm. In fact, we can view these words as encouragement — "Keep Calm and Steward On," no matter what comes our way.

One of the blessings of a stewardship way of life is that in challenging times, whether in our homes or workplaces or even our beloved Church itself, we can take great comfort in knowing we have a concrete plan to keep our priorities in proper order. And, when we put God first in all aspects of our lives, we will experience the peace that He gives that surpasses all understanding.

# Dear Padre,

I am confused by Genesis 6:6: "The LORD regretted making human beings on the earth, and his heart was grieved." How can a perfect being regret something he created in his own image?

Sometimes reading an isolated line of Scripture can be confusing. Context is essential. The Second Vatican



Council's Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation (Dei Verbum), promulgated by Pope St. Paul VI on November 18, 1965, clearly teaches this Catholic understanding of sacred Scripture. A proper appreciation of context, in the example you provided, reminds us that the holy writers of Scripture were not reporting the words of the Lord like an announcer on the evening news. This is not a newspaper account of a witnessed event or a report commenting on the scene that has unfolded. Biblical authors were constrained by their own experience and perception, even as they were inspired by the Spirit of God. When they made a conclusion, they frequently revealed more about their humanity than they did about the divinity they witnessed. The divine is just too wonderful and mysterious for humans to fully comprehend.

The author of Genesis provided a summary of how the experience of the creative activity of God was perceived. It is not the whole story and is perhaps best understood more as a contrast with Genesis 1:31, where we read that on the sixth day, "God looked at everything he had made, and found it very good." .
